Coronavirus is not responsible for domestic abuse and government advice surrounding social isolation and distancing has created further opportunity for perpetrators to exert power and control over their victims. We also know that the lasting impact on children and young people living in households with a perpetrator of domestic abuse is significant and we are committed to ensuring they are protected too.

All domestic abuse services remain open, and our top priority is to ensure victims get the support they need.

We have temporary arrangements in place to ensure victims are triaged and risk assessed as quickly as possible.

We are encouraging victims of domestic abuse to contact the Hertfordshire Independent Domestic Violence Advocacy Service (IDVA) in the first instance (0300 790 6772).

Whilst specialist services have been impacted too they are still very much available and ready to respond. This guide provides information about what services are available and how they are operating to help.

<u>Hestia</u> provides a range of initiatives to support the professional sectors and victims. They manage the national <u>UK SAYS NO MORE</u> campaign and related <u>'Safe Space'</u> solution; with Boots Pharmacists they launched a national service to allow victims fleeing to

access help and support safely at Boots stores. <u>Superdrug and 60+ other independent pharmacies</u> and <u>Morrison's Supermarkets</u> have also now joined the campaign.

<u>BrightSky</u> - a free to download mobile app (Hestia), providing support and information to anyone who may be in an abusive relationship or those concerned about someone they know. The app is also designed to be used by practitioners, and for anyone looking for information about issues around domestic abuse such as online safety, stalking and harassment and sexual consent.

<u>Hollie Guard</u> - next generation smartphone app that provides enhanced levels of protection, which essentially transforms your smartphone into an advanced personal safety device. All you need to do is shake your phone or tap the screen and you generate an alert, which automatically sends your location and audio/video evidence to your emergency contacts.
