WELCOME TO THE 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM 2025- SPECIAL EDITION OF SUNFLOWER NEWS

Every year, people across the world come together to celebrate the international <u>16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence</u> campaign, which runs from 25 November (International Day Against Violence Against Women) to the 10 December (International Human Rights Day).

16 Days of Activism calls for an end to gender-based violence, also commonly known as 'Violence against women and girls (VAWG)'. VAWG describes a range of harmful or abusive behaviours that disproportionately affect women and girls, including sexual violence, stalking and harassment, domestic abuse, 'so called' Honour-based abuse and revenge porn. They can affect anyone and have traumatic, long-lasting impacts.

PART ONE: Campaign Information:

16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence (25 Nov – 10 Dec):

In 2025, the international campaign's theme (via UN Women UK) is <u>#NoExcuseforOnlineAbuse</u>. Hertfordshire's Domestic Abuse (DA) and VAWG Partnership take part in the campaign each year and encourage all Partners and residents of Hertfordshire to take part in two key initiatives, Orange the World, and White Ribbon Day.

How can you get involved?

This special edition newsletter includes a huge schedule of events and opportunities happening across Hertfordshire, open to both professionals and the public to get involved in. You can attend an event that is already planned or hold your own awareness event or fundraiser! Alongside the public events, many organisations and workplaces take part by holding internal fundraisers and training, such as:

- The University of Hertfordshire is holding an event for staff and students on 4th December. 'For the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Based Violence, Hertfordshire University will be hosting an event with the partner agencies in The VAWG sector. This collaboration with specialist services will give the opportunity for students to meet support teams, access tools and receive information to help them navigate DA and SV. There is emphasis on LGBTQ support, disability and mental health support, and our lovely Therapy Dog Poppy will be in attendance!'
- For Baby's Sake charity will pledge to walk 10,000 steps per day for 16 days, aiming to reach 160,000 steps per person by the end of the 16 days. 'Collectively, we hope to reach over 5 million steps across the 16 days'
- SAHWR is holding a variety of in-house events and training for the local sector, alongside facilitating healthy relationship workshops to Yr 5's within four schools in the St Albans area.
- Hertfordshire County Council White Ribbon Steering Committee is holding six events for staff across 16 Days of Activism, including Bystander Intervention training
- Watford Borough Council will be holding an internal White Ribbon Accreditation and new safeguarding policy event, with a cake sale and raffle to raise money for White Ribbon UK, giving staff the opportunity to sign up and make the White Ribbon Promise.
- Hertfordshire Domestic Abuse Helpline will be holding a series of district-based walks, events, poster campaigns and social media posting with an
 aim to raise awareness of local support available for victims and survivors of domestic abuse, track local engagement and needs through QR codes
 displayed on campaign posters and align resources and messaging across all districts to ensure consistency, accessibility, and collaboration.
 'Together, we're making sure that every resident in Hertfordshire knows where to turn for help and that every borough is part of the same message:
 support is here, and no one is alone'.

Orange the World

'Orange the World' is Part of the UN UNITE Campaign to end violence against women by 2030. It encourages public buildings, spaces, organisations, and individuals to use the colour orange to raise awareness of violence against women and girls. The colour orange represents a brighter future, free from violence. 'Orange the World' is encouraged during the whole 16 Days of Activism period (25 November – 10 December).

How can you get involved?

You are encouraged to take part in a variety of ways, such as wearing orange during 16 Days of Activism, lighting up your building or displaying posters and orange balloons in your window. Get creative! Alongside 'Oranging' the world, why not hold an awareness raising workshop or attend an existing partnership event?

- Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council will be lighting up the clock tower above the Campus East building in Welwyn Garden City and Coronation Fountain in Parkway Welwyn Garden City
- Hertfordshire County Council will be lighting up County Hall, Hertford- in partnership with Soroptimist's International Hertford & District
- St. Albans Museum & Gallery, Odyssey Cinema & Eric Morecambe Centre Harpenden will be lit up, with support from Soroptimist's International St. Albans & District
- In East Herts, look out for The Corn Exchange & Waytemore Mound in Bishops Stortford lighting up orange, alongside the Ware and Sawbridgeworth Town Councils.

What is White Ribbon Day?

- White Ribbon UK is working to prevent all forms of male violence against women, including domestic abuse, harassment, and assault. It does this by raising awareness and engaging with men and boys to prevent violence and promote gender equality and diversity through culture change.
- Individuals can make the White Ribbon Promise, 'to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women', and wear their white ribbons to raise awareness and show solidarity. They can also commit to becoming White Ribbon ambassadors or champions, engaging with others and promoting culture change around the topic of violence against women and girls.
- Organisations can become 'White Ribbon Accredited', meaning they commit to a range of positive actions to promote culture change within their
 own organisations and local communities. Many Hertfordshire organisations are already White Ribbon Accredited, or working on achieving their
 accreditation, such as Hertfordshire County Council, Herts Fire & Rescue Service and St. Albans District Council.
- White Ribbon Day takes place on 25 November every year, raising awareness about the work of White Ribbon and the need for male allyship in ending violence against women and girls. The theme for 2025 is 'We Speak Up'.

This year's theme: We Speak Up

Letting sexism slide puts women and girls at risk. Sexist jokes, catcalling, staring, and comments might seem harmless, but they are serious because they can lead to violence and abuse. This White Ribbon Day 2025, we want more men to use their voices and speak up to create a world where everyone is safe, equal and respected. Every time we ignore something that doesn't feel right, we miss a chance to set a better example.

White Ribbon is shining a spotlight on 16 White Ribbon UK Ambassadors, who are making a real difference in their communities. From a firefighter to an apprentice and a family lawyer, <u>our Ambassadors are united in one thing – they choose to speak up.</u> You can find out more about this year's theme by <u>visiting our website</u>.


